


IMPACTS

- 1.5 million cubic yards of sand on the County's beaches
- \$4.3 million spent on beach renourishment
- 99% compliance on regulatory sea turtle lighting inspections
- Protected endangered species
- Maintained critical protection of coastal properties and infrastructure

COASTAL HABITAT PROTECTION





Goal 2. Maintain diverse resilient ecosystems

- 4 nesting pairs of American Oystercatchers hatched and raised eight chicks
- 51 acres of land area that's been added for future conservation purposes
- 50% of County Parks tree inventory was completed
- \$10,000 funding for bird and pollinator gardens at Busch Wildlife's new Rocky Pines Campus in Jupiter, FL
- **57,781 volunteer hours** dedicated to environmental stewardship = \$1.7 million cost savings





Goal 3. Protect and support human health, safety, water quality and quality of life





WATER QUALITY

- 85,300+ tests were performed by the WUD with 100% regulatory compliance
- 1,605 miles of street sweeping to improve water quality and prevent storm sewer clogging
- \$183 million in grant funding to provide 4.8 billion gallons of long-term water storage in the C-51 Reservoir Phase 2

SAFETY

- 3 community improvement projects completed within 3 Countywide Community Revitalization Team areas
- \$2 million committed to the Corbett Levee upgrade project

COMPLIANCE

- 100% completion of Petroleum Storage Tank Compliance Program
- 100% completion of all permitted wellfield facilities inspections

Goal 4. Ensure positive environmental experiences for residents and visitors

- 1,050 events & 37,000+ participants at Park's nature centers, Riverbend & PBC natural areas
- 78 programs & 1,684 participants at library environmental programs
- 10,292 youth attended Mounts Botanical Garden environmental programs
- 7,500+ participants attended the ERM LagoonFest & Natural Areas Festival
- Expanded park facilities, including Paulette Burdick Park, Gramercy Park Neighborhood Center, Villages of Windsor Phase I, Green Cay Phase II











Goal 5. Promote sustainable, resilient practices and principles



EMISSIONS REDUCTION

- 2,363 streetlights converted to LED
- 288 light fixtures at parks upgraded to LED
- 2,201 permits issued for solar installations
- 69 permits for electric vehicle charging stations



RESOURCE CONSERVATION

- 27 million gallons of water reclaimed per day for use as landscape irrigation
- 19 touchless water refill stations installed



- 162 attendees to climate risk community workshops
- 42 PBC municipal representatives attended the Palm Beach County Flood Workshop
- Collaborated with the SE FL Regional Climate Change Compact to host the Regional Climate Summit & Resilience Affordable Housing Workshop







Goal 6. Preserve and enhance our thriving agriculture



- 48 educational events for 2,206 commercial farmers and plant nursery operators
- 99 safety trainings for 1,769 agriculture workforce clients
- 2,597 CEUs delivered that support staterequired licenses related to agriculture workforce safety





- 239 urban horticulture teaching events reaching 5,597 citizens, emphasizing:
 - √ Home vegetable/herb gardening
 - ✓ Florida-Friendly™ Landscaping principles
 - ✓ Specialty plants (orchids, bonsai, succulents)

Environmental Protection Legacy In Palm Beach County

1984 - 1987 A citizen-led initiative recommended the best ecosystems for preservation to the BCC, which led in part to the creation of the Department of Environmental Resources Management in 1987.

1991 & 1999 Citizens approved \$300 million in bonds to acquire over 31,000 acres of conservation lands, improve parks, and create the Agricultural Reserve.

1992 - 2005 PBC Parks & Recreation built three nature centers.

1996 & 2004 Wakodahatchee & Green Cay Wetlands were constructed by WUD.

1997 - 2003 The Countywide Community Revitalization Team and the Office of Community Revitalization were created.

State Water and Land Legacy Amendment approved by 84.7% of PBC voters, the highest of any Florida county.

BCC created the Office of Resilience, which supports sustainable development and environmental resiliency.






